Caging Reptile Lawyers

According to David Ball and Don Keenan, the tactics and strategies set out in their book -"Reptile: The 2009 Manual of The Plaintiff's Revolution" - have resulted in verdicts across the country totaling over \$5.9 billion. Several prominent lawyers on the plaintiffs' side have cited this book as the new bible of successful advocacy. Defense lawyers would do well to become familiar with the concepts, now being taught in trial advocacy courses and at CLEs throughout the country. As one senior VP of an insurer put it:

We've seen Reptile several times.

Better know what it is.

Better hire lawyers that know what it is.

Better develop strategies on how to confront it.

If you don't do any of the above; better have resume updated.
